Dear Mr. Aljabiry:

Please find attached the Tahoe Metropolitan Planning Organizations (TMPO) 2008-2012 Federal Transportation Improvement Program (FTIP) Formal Amendment #3. On April 22<sup>nd</sup> the TMPO Governing Board unanimously approved of this amendment adjusting the cost, scope, and schedule to three existing projects and adds one new project. TMPO requests your expeditious review and approval of this amendment as two of these projects include the addition of American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) funds.

### FINANCIAL CONSTRAINT:

The changes requested in this FTIP amendment do not exceed the total amount of funding that is available and is financially constrained. The Safe, Accountable, Flexible, Efficient, Transportation Equity Act: A Legacy for Users (SAFETEA-LU) requires that all federally-funded highway and transit projects must be develop from a fiscally constrained planning and programming process. Fiscal constraint requires that revenues in transportation planning and programming (Federal, State, local, and private) are identified and are reasonably expected to be available to implement the Regional Transportation Plan and Federal Transportation Improvement Program, while providing for the operation and maintenance of the existing highway and transit systems.

### AIR QUALITY CONFORMITY / RTP CONSISTENCY:

This amendment is exempt from an air quality conformity analysis, and the 2008 FTIP's Conformity Determination approved of by the Federal Highway Administration on January 26, 2008 is still the adopted analysis. The proposed amendment is consistent with the TMPO's Regional Transportation Plan (RTP) referred to as "Mobility 2030" that was adopted on August 27<sup>th</sup>, 2008. This amendment does not interfere with the timely implementation of Transportation Control Measures (TCM's) contained in the State Implementation Plan (SIP).

Transportation conformity is a process for ensuring that federal funds are not used on projects that might impact the attainment of the federal air quality standards set forth in the Federal Clean Air Act and its Amendments of 1990. The Transportation Conformity Rule appears in 40 CFR Parts 51 and 93 and is applicable to transportation plans developed pursuant to 23 CFR part 450 or 49 CFR part 613 by a Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO). This Transportation Conformity Rule requires all jurisdictions in non-attainment areas or who are under federally approved maintenance plans to submit a conformity analysis if the planning or programming documents identify projects that have been defined as non-exempt. The Tahoe Metropolitan Planning Organization (TMPO) is responsible for conducting conformity determinations for both the California and Nevada portions of the Basin where conformity requirements apply.

### **PUBLIC PARTICIPATION:**

As required by Federal regulations, a Formal Amendment is subject to public review. The TMPO's Public Participation Plan (PPP) requires this public review process to be open for a 30 day period. The TMPO publicly noticed this amendment on February 13, 2009 at its regularly scheduled Tahoe Transportation Commission (TTC) meeting as well as posting notification on the TRPA website.

Section 450 of 23 CFR of SAFETEA-LU requires MPO's to provide all interested parties with a reasonable opportunity to comment on the proposed transportation improvement program. The 2008 FTIP has been developed under TMPO policies for community input and interagency consultation procedures. Projects included in this FTIP are projects proposed for funding under Title 23 (highway) or under Title 49 (transit), or projects for which approval by the FHWA or the FTA is required, or non-federally funded projects with regional transportation impacts. The TMPO in coordination with local, regional, state and federal agencies selected all projects in this FTIP for funding with federal and/or other funds. The Tahoe Transportation Commission (TTC) is required to review this document and any Formal Amendments to this document and provided input into its development, and make recommendation of endorsement prior to submittal to the TMPO. The TTC is a publicly open meeting that occurs the second Friday of every month.

## ADOPTION OF FORMAL AMENDMENT #3 TO THE 2008-2012 FEDERAL TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM FOR THE LAKE TAHOE REGION

WHEREAS, the Tahoe Metropolitan Planning Organization (TMPO) is the designated planning organization for the Lake Tahoe Basin as defined by the Transportation Equity Act for the 21st Century; and

WHEREAS, the 2008 TMPO Federal Transportation Improvement Program (FTIP) has been developed and maintained in accordance with the Safe, Accountable, Flexible and Efficient Transportation Equity Act – A Legacy for Users (SAFETEA-LU); and

WHEREAS, the Federal Clean Air Act Amendments require that no department, agency, or instrumentality of the Federal Government shall engage in, support in any way or provide financial assistance for, license or permit, or approve an activity which does not conform to an implementation plan approved or promulgated under Section 110; and

WHEREAS, no metropolitan planning organization designated under Title 23 of the U.S. Code shall give its approval to any project, program or plan which does not conform to an implementation plan approved or promulgated under Section 110; and

WHEREAS, the assurance of conformity to an implementation plan is the affirmative responsibility of the TMPO; and

WHEREAS, the 2008 Regional Transportation Plan for the Lake Tahoe Basin describes a transportation system envisioned for the horizon years and was adopted as a financially constrained plan by the TMPO Board on August 27, 2008; and

WHEREAS, the 2008 FTIP is consistent with the transportation system and financial plan described in the 2008 Regional Transportation Plan; and

WHEREAS, the 2008 FTIP is financially constrained by year and includes a financial plan that demonstrates which projects can be implemented using committed funds; and

WHEREAS, the 2008 FTIP includes all regionally significant transportation projects to be funded from local, state or federal resources; and

WHEREAS, the 2008 FTIP has been developed under TMPO policies for community input and interagency consultation procedures; and

WHEREAS, during the life of the program, it is sometimes necessary to amend the program to reflect changes in project costs, scopes or schedules, or to add new projects; and

WHEREAS, the 2008 FTIP is now in need of amendment; and

WHEREAS, the 2008 FTIP Amendment #3 does not interfere with the timely implementation of any approved Transportation Control Measure; and

WHEREAS, the 2008 FTIP Amendment #3 was found to conform to the applicable State Implementation Plan; and

WHEREAS, the 2008 FTIP Amendment #3 conformity determination was based on the 2008 Regional Transportation Plan for the Lake Tahoe Basin; and

WHEREAS, the 2008 FTIP Amendment #3 is air quality exempt and no further conformity determination is required; and

WHEREAS, the 2008 FTIP Amendment #3 meets all applicable transportation planning requirements per 23 Code of Federal Regulations Part 450; and

WHEREAS, the Tahoe Transportation Commission recommended the TMPO adopt the proposed 2008 FTIP Amendment #3;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the TMPO hereby adopts the Amendment #3 as shown on Exhibit 1 (attached) to the 2008 FTIP.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that TMPO staff is hereby directed and authorized to work with Caltrans, the Nevada Department of Transportation, the Federal Highway Administration, the Federal Transit Administration and the Environmental Protection Agency to make whatever technical changes or corrections are needed to the format and organization of the document to obtain its approval by these agencies.

Requested Action: Governing Board Adoption of the Attached Resolution (Attachment A) approving the Formal Amendment #3 to the 2008 Federal Transportation Improvement Program (FTIP).

<u>Staff Recommendation:</u> Staff recommends that the Governing Board adopt the attached resolution (Attachment A).

<u>TTC Recommendation:</u> The Commission has endorsed FTIP Amendment #3 and recommends TMPO Governing Board adoption.

Required Motion: In order to adopt the proposed resolution, the Board must make the following motion, based on this staff summary and the evidence in the record:

1) A motion to approve the attached Resolution (see Attachment C)

In order for the motion to pass, an affirmative vote of any 8 Board Members is required.

### Background:

### What is the Federal Transportation Improvement Program (FTIP)?

The TMPO Federal Transportation Improvement Program, otherwise referred to as the FTIP, is a financially constrained list of surface transportation projects that are reasonably expected to be funded between 2008 and 2012. Any transportation project which is funded with federal monies or is considered regionally significant must be included in the FTIP as required by the federal transportation bill referred to as the Safe, Accountable, Flexible, and Efficient Transportation Equity Act: A Legacy for Users (SAFETEA-LU).

### Amending the FTIP:

There are two acceptable methods for amending the FTIP; 1) For minor project changes the MPO Executive Director has the authority to approve of an "Administrative Modification" for submittal and approval by the Federal Highway Administration, and 2) for major project changes the TMPO must publicly notice any change for thirty-days as specified by the TMPO's Public Participation Plan (PPP) and then by TMPO Board Resolution submit a "Formal Amendment" to the Federal Highway Administration for approval.

### FTIP Formal Amendment #3 Projects:

The attached project changes (Attachment A) are considered a Formal Amendment to the 2008 FTIP and have been presented to the Tahoe Transportation Commission and publicly noticed. Attachment B specifies comments received and the amendments being presented have addressed these comments.

This amendment makes adjustments to three projects and includes one new project:

- 1) Tahoe City Transit Center
- 2) Blue Go Bus Replacement
- 3) State Route 207 Kingsbury Grade Water Quality Improvements
- 4) McKinney Rubicon Trail (New Project)

### **American Recovery and Reinvestment Act:**

Of particular importance to this amendment is the inclusion of federal economic stimulus funds which were allocated to TRPA via the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA). In January the TMPO was advised to amend the FTIP to include an estimated amount of \$3.25 million in ARRA funds to be programmed for transportation projects. This request was made at that time due to a stipulation in the Federal Act that a portion of the funds needed to be obligated to a project within 120 days of the Acts enactment in association with the lengthy approval process for making Formal FTIP Amendments. The TMPO Board approved of this action in Formal Amendment #1 on February 27<sup>th</sup>.

Recently a final allocation of ARRA funds were provided to the TRPA which amounts to \$2,423,968 for capital improvements and \$228,591 for transit service enhancements which is less than the original estimate. This officially approved amount will be amended into the FTIP. Working with through the TTC, capital projects were prioritized based on eligibility and the projects readiness to begin construction. This amendment programs \$1.8 million of ARRA funds for the construction of the Tahoe City Transit Center and \$228,591 for transit assistance for BlueGO and the Tahoe Area Regional Transit (TART) systems.

### Issues/Concerns:

There is urgency in moving quickly to obligate a portion of the Federal Stimulus funds from the date that the Bill was signed. In order not to jeopardize loosing funds from the Tahoe Basin a portion of the funds must be obligated to a project by June 1, 2009 and construction or procurement of projects must begin in the summer of 2009. The remaining balance of funds can be obligated at a later date but must be put to use prior to August 2010.

Regional Plan Compliance: The proposed resolution complies with all requirements of the TRPA Goals and Policies, Plan Area Statements, and Code of Ordinances
